- Sunday Creek following up with State budget award
- ORCA expansion is enabled by addition of staff structure
 - Plan to ask Athens County for ARPA funding to support ORCA's work to strategically build back Athens County's and the regional economy led by Athens County's recreation assets like the Baileys Trail System
- EDA coalition member for EDA Build Back Better Regional Challenge (\$25-\$75 million investment to grow outdoor product manufacturing in Central Appalachia)
 - Will also submit EDA Travel, Tourism, and Recreation application
- Purchased office equipment
- AWOADC nonprofit status application has been filed

- Phase 3 construction is complete and open
- Continue to work towards development of Buchtel trailhead location evaluation
- 2021 Membership Launched
- Merchandise is ready to go—will be launched when bank account is established
- Rural Action posted an RFP for regional asset mapper for ARC POWER project 7 counties
- Meeting with Muskingum Watershed District and Steve Walker, chair of Ohio Trails Partnership & BTA
- Meetings with OU Outdoor Pursuits regarding potential partnerships
- ORCA Advisory Board met last week and would like to nominate Bruce Martin
 (OU) for Board position & Paul Logue (Athens City Planner)
 (Motion to nominate Martin & Logue: Lenny Eliason; Second: Amy Renner; Approved)
- ORCA Advisory Board believe ORCA should assist with opening restrooms if needed
 - Amy Renner—bathrooms can open when security locks are installed from (NatureWorks Grant that was just awarded)
- Draft Report from OU Economic Impact study: directly attributes \$3.6 million from year 1 Baileys Trail System visitation
- 2021 ARC POWER grant start date October 1, 2021
- Audits filed & completed for 2019 & 2020
- Proposal to Athens County Commissioners for ARPA funding
 - Director of Finance \$75,000
 - Responsible for financial management, grant and impact investment reporting.
 - Comparable to other similar position posted recently from Southeast Ohio Advocacy Center Ohio average is \$140,000 annually and \$72,000 is the 10th percental for the state

Lenny Eliason- Was this salary amount enough to attract a qualified candidate? Jessie Powers- I will follow up to find out.

- Director of Sustainable Recreation
 - Assist member communities with recreation maintenance needs
- Director of Communications (will be covered by 2021 POWER grant)
 - Manage website and social media, record keeping, develop marketing materials, and philanthropic campaigns
- Costs total \$350,000 for two years, but add capacity to on board members and reduce future membership fees
